1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Leroy Blanchard, Chairman; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Chris Carter.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Myron Matherne.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Michael Dias, Mr. Jamie Ponville.
2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the committee approve payment of the bills submitted through April 21, 2023." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Chairman Leroy Blanchard recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that the reports were included in the Juror packets. She stated that there is not plan of action needed at this time and recommended approval.
4. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the Budget Comparison Statements for major funds for March 2023." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Leroy Blanchard recognized the Assistant Parish Manager, who stated that the Jury tabled the purchase of a 6" pump to decide on the funding source. He stated that the low bid was \$32,966 submitted by M&L Engine. Chairman Leroy Blanchard suggested that GOMESA non-bond funds be used for the purchase. A brief discussion was then held regarding the need to purchase two (2) pumps and the total would violate the public bid law. Following the discussion, the committee agreed to purchase two (2) providing it's within the guidelines of the public bid law.
6. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the low bid of \$32,966 submitted by M&L Engine for the purchase of two (2) 6" pumps using GOMESA non-bond funds providing it's within public bid law if not, only one (1) pump will be purchased." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. The Assistant Parish Manager stated that bids were accepted for repairs to the Old Courthouse Roof and the low bid was submitted by Sage Construction in the amount of \$48,088.37. A brief discussion was then held regarding the repair inclusions, the walk through with each contractor and the total bid comparison. Following the discussion, the committee agreed to accept the low bid.
8. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve to accept the low bid of \$48,088.37 submitted by Sage Construction for the Old Courthouse Roof Project as authorized by the ADA." The motion was adopted with Ron Alcorn voting nay.
9. Chairman Leroy Blanchard recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that Lafourche Parish 4-H Youth Department is requesting an all day use of the LSU Ag Center on June 10, 2023 because their facility is still being repaired. She stated that they are requesting the use of 25 stalls and 25 horses at no cost. A brief discussion was then held regarding the request. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed that they would deny the request.
10. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the committee approve to deny the request by Lafourche Parish 4-H Youth Department to use the LSU Ag Center at no cost." The motion was adopted with committee member Jeff Naquin voting nay.
11. Chairman Leroy Blanchard informed the committee that the FFA will be utilizing the LSU Ag Center on Friday and Saturday. He then stated that they will be utilizing 35 stalls on Friday but only a few on Saturday and would like the Jury to authorize them to collect for the stalls that will be used on Saturday and turn the funds in on Monday.
12. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the FFA to track and collect for stall rental on Saturday and turn the funds in on Monday." The motion was unanimously adopted.
13. Chairman Leroy Blanchard recognized the Assistant Parish Manager, who gave the following update on the repairs due to Hurricane Ida. He stated that the fence at the Labadieville Park has been repaired and the roof on the Bertrandville Park has been replaced.

14. Committee member Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, April 26, 2023
5:45 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Leroy Blanchard, Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Michael Dias, Mr. Jamie Ponville.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson.
Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Chris Carter.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Jacob Loeske, GIS Engineering, who stated that the hard and electronic copies of the Drainage Master Plan has been submitted to CPRA and President Blanchard has the Jury's copies. He stated that they are working on the pre-app for the LWI application which has been extended to May 31, 2023. He added that further review and discussion can be held. In response to the guide, Mr. Loeske stated that they want to see the inventory but they are not using it for the 1st round. He stated that they are pre-screening the application and if it's worthy they will inform you to move forward. He then stated that there are other funding sources they are looking into starting with Protect which has a deadline of June 2023. In response, he stated that it shouldn't take long if the Parish wishes to add additional projects because much of the information is already done.
3. Committee member Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
4. In response, Mr. Loeske stated that there is time to submit additional projects in Round 2 of LWI and low to moderate, distressed and disadvantaged projects are requested. He stated that he has not received anything back on the last application relative to the APCC. He then stated that Dupaty Park survey is underway and they are looking into the boundaries. In response relative to seeking the sewer system, committee member Ron Alcorn stated that there is free funding that Mr. Loeske researched that would allow the school system to have more capacity and it requires no match. In response, Mr. Ponville stated that in the long run it will cost the Parish for maintenance personnel to operate the system. The Parish Engineer stated that there is a lift station out there but it will be eliminated once the sewer system is put in place. He also stated that when the power goes out during an emergency and the system is used for the shelter, they don't power the school so we lose the treatment side of the system. He then stated that we can hook the treatment to the existing generator and be self-sufficient.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OHSEP Director, who stated that at the last meeting the Jury spoke about the 3 possible HMGP grants and two (2) are competitive. He stated that the Jury decided that 1st priority would be the Public Works Building and 2nd priority would be Cleaning of Waterways. He stated that there were some concerns that this funding could only be used for flood control but after some research, the Parish has a Hazard Mitigation Plan. He then stated that the Public Works building and flood control measures are within that plan therefore, these projects will qualify. He also stated that changes to that plan can take place yearly so if anything is to be added, changes can be made as needed. The OHSEP Director then stated that the Jury decided to use the \$4.4 million that the parish has for the Courthouse repairs and stated that under the FEMA site they defined and identified what the funds can be used for. He proceeded to read what is stated under Retro Fit and stated that after speaking with the Parish Manager, the building has been experiencing problems with the sewer which is tied in with the drainage therefore, will fit within the scope of the Retro Fit definition. He stated that he sent the plans of the two(2) competitive grants to GOHSEP and will begin working on the applications. He stated that GOHSEP stated on it's competitive grants there would be a 10% match however, it wouldn't come from the Parish but he needs to validate where the funds would be coming from. He further stated that he will also look into if a match is needed for the HMGP funding and if so, will the Parish be responsible. Committee member Leroy Blanchard suggested that we contact an architect that specializes in historic buildings to see how we move forward in the right capacity. The Parish Engineer stated that his office has reached out to a few people since his office is having to put together budgets and estimates for the OHSEP. In response, he stated that he has been assisting the OHSEP Director with the application and has several estimates put together from the past. He also stated that he isn't charging the Jury for this work just satisfying the wishes of some of the Jurors. A brief discussion was held regarding futuristic cost for the work that has been done. The Parish Engineer stated that he will halt all assistance that is being given to the OHSEP Director or any Juror without the approval of the Jury.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he sent the committee a letter providing three (3) options given that the contractor for the Attakapas Landing Project has made a claim of no work as they disagree with the claim because there is still numerous things to be done on the sight and he has never been given a directive to stop. He stated that they have been obtaining prices and in negotiation with him for some additions that need to be done and to move forward with. He stated that they had not included the sheet pile walls along the sides of the concrete launch and wooden decks along sides of the launch. He then stated that they requested deducts from the contractor for the unit prices as well as looking into reducing the cost of the restroom to help cover the cost and bring it down. He stated that the three (3) options that were presented will result in a credit including the additional work that the

Parish wants done. In response, committee member Michael Dias suggested option (2) so that the project can continue moving. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that the contractor had people on site but from what he could tell, they didn't get much accomplished. He also stated that the numbers came from the contractor. He simply took the requested numbers that we sent and requested deduct and increased numbers from him and applied it into three (3) different options. He also stated that this came from his original bid and that the contractor submitted additional cost and deducts in writing.

7. Committee member Michael Dias offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the committee approve selection of Option (2) change order for the Attakapas Landing Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. The Parish Engineer stated that per the direction of the Jury, he met on site with the contractor for the Bertrandville Drainage Outfall Cleaning and Snagging Project and a scope change had taken place during the bid processing of the project. He stated that the contractor has reviewed the area and at this time is not offering any type of credit for the work that was previously done. He stated that it's his opinion that his mobilization cost, etc. are the same regardless of the amount of work that was done. He then recommended that the project be terminated, rescope and readvertised. He added that the Parish may want to seek legal guidance on how to terminate the award. He stated that the original bid was \$228,800 and \$100,000 was budgeted. He again stated that the project has to be terminated and the award rescinded. He also stated that LA Contracting was the contractor. He further stated that the proper motion is to reject all bids, rescope the project and readvertise. Police Juror Chris Carter requested that the Secretary-Treasurer look into the matter and place it on the next agenda.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the project is in the permitting process and moving through the channels of the Corp of Engineers and DNR. He stated that DNR has deemed that the application is complete and no further clarification is needed. Once the internal circulation is complete, they will put it out for public notice.
10. The Parish Engineer stated that the Lee Drive Project is underway and they are currently working to cut the road to remove and replace the culverts as needed. He stated that they have marked all the areas to install the catchbasins and patched much of the road. He then stated that at the moment they are beginning their leveling courses. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that the curve by Aucoin St. has been addressed and briefly explained. He stated that he was directed to bring the road above the 4.0 level and he has exceeded that mark.
11. The Parish Engineer stated that the plans for the ring levees in Upper Pierre Part are finished and he has brought a set for Juror Ponville. He stated that he attempted to email them to the entire Jury but it was rejected due to the size. However, he is placing it on a thumb drive along with several other projects to be delivered to the Jury.
12. Committee member Michael Dias offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jamie Ponville, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Leroy Blanchard in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chambers located at 4813 Hwy 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Michael Dias, Ward 5; Mr. Chris Carter, Ward 6; Mr. Leroy Blanchard, Ward 7; Mr. Jamie Ponville, Ward 8.
Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Myron Matherne.
3. President Leroy Blanchard led the Prayer and Vice-President Jeff Naquin led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Michael Dias, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of March 22, 2023, March 29, 2023 and April 12, 2023." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Leroy Blanchard requested comments, questions or concerns regarding any item on the agenda. He then recognized Mrs. Beryl Gomez, 664 Michel Rd., Pierre Part, who commented on items 14 and 15 from the agenda. She stated that she has been working with the National Flood Insurance Program rating for a long time and FEMA hasn't been very transparent since they put the program into effect October 2021. She stated that the homeowners started reviewing their declaration page and noticed the full premium is shown but you can't get any information regarding the rates. She also stated there are no further credits given as was done under the old rate when you built above the base flood elevations. Mrs. Gomez proceeded to explain the information that was just released by FEMA relative to what the policy is going to be when it reaches full policy rate by zip code. She gave a few examples of what the policies will be going to and stated that efforts are being done at the Capital to try and change the 18% per year to a 9% per year. She also stated that efforts are being made to reverse the 2.0 and go back to the old set rate until this can be looked into further. She further requested that the Police Jury consider joining in with the Legislature.
6. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received.
7. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Jamie Ponville, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: re-appointment of Stephen Simoneaux, Rodney Simoneaux, Keith Dugas and Dan Aysenne to the Plattenville Drainage District #5 for a 5 yr. term, re-appointment of Kirk Landry, Niki Lacoste and Chad Boudreaux to the Oakridge Gravity Drainage District #5 for a 5 yr. term, \$2,300 for 133 Scott Dr. Culvert Replacement Project, \$2,600 for 5111 Hwy 1 Catchbasins Project, \$2,470 for 3013 Lee Dr. Culvert Replacement Project, \$1,500 for Bayou Drive Levee Repair Project., \$3,180 for 125 Paul St. Culvert Replacement Project and reallocating funds from project #92882 and #92889 to Oak Lake Rd. Project.
8. Police Juror Jamie Ponville offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
9. President Leroy Blanchard stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; payment of bills submitted through April 21, 2023, Budget Comparison Statements for March 2023, accepted low bid of \$32,966 submitted by M&L Engine for the purchase of two (2) 6" pumps using GOMESA non-bond funds providing it's within public bid law if not, only one (1) pump will be purchased, accepted the low bid of \$48,088.37 submitted by Sage Construction for the Old Courthouse Roof Project as authorized by the ADA, denied the request by Lafourche Parish 4-H Youth Department to use the LSU Ag Center at no cost, authorized the FFA to track and collect for stall rentals on Saturday and turn the funds in on Monday and received an update on the repairs due to Hurricane Ida.
10. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
11. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Federal Programs Committee Chairman Ron Alcorn, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; authorized the Special Programs Director to apply for Entergy "Beat the Heat Fans" Grant in the amount of \$2,000 and authorized the Special Programs Director to apply for the Entergy Education Grant Assistance in the amount of \$1,000.

12. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Federal Programs Committee report as present." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
13. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Road & Bridge Committee Chairman Ron Alcorn, who stated that the committee met and recommended that the speed bump application for Violet St. be approved.
14. Police Juror Ron Alcorn offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the speed bump application submitted for Violet St." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
15. President Leroy Blanchard recognized the Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; received an update from GIS Engineering, an update from the OHSEP Director regarding the HMGP funding and its use, approved option (2) change order for the Attakapas Landing Project, received an update on Gerald St. Levee permit, Lee Drive Project and the ring levees in upper Pierre Part.
16. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
17. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Mr. Ernie Blanchard, 3904 Hwy 1, Napoleonville, who thanked the Jury for his nomination to the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District and stated it's an honor to represent the Parish on the board. He stated that he would like to update the Jury periodically on the activities that would affect the Parish directly. He proceeded to present an update of the major things that are taking place at this time: Donaldsonville Pump Station which will increase the water capacity, Bayou Lafourche Clean Up Project, Napoleonville Bayou Park and Kayak Launch, the Sewer Treatment Plant Program and the Barataria Estuary Project, which will be hosting a program on May 11, 2023 at Nicholls State University. Mr. Blanchard offered to represent Assumption Parish at that program. Following the update, the Secretary-Treasurer and the Parish Manager mentioned the hand rails that the Police Jury was supposed to assist with for the Napoleonville Bayou Park and Kayak Launch. The Parish Manager stated that he had not received any plans, etc. indicating how to proceed. In response, Mr. Blanchard stated that he would follow up on the matter and report to the Parish Manager. He further stated that he would like to report to the Parish quarterly regarding any and all updates. Police Juror Ron Alcorn informed Mr. Blanchard of the trees that are in the Bayou. In response, the Parish Manager stated that he saw the trees and informed Josh, the maintenance personnel who agreed to look into it.
18. President Leroy Blanchard recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who requested to modify the items regarding the Registrar of Voters Office. She stated that she received a request from the Registrar to fill the Deputy Registrar position with Chaille Hebert who started on April 4, 2023. She stated the last employee in that position was receiving \$201.60 bi-weekly following the increase that was granted in December, 2022. Police Juror Chris Carter stated that the Jury doesn't supplement any of their employees therefore, he would request the Jury compensate only what's required by the State. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer stated that she's not sure of the inception date of the supplement to the Registrar's Office it was already in place at her employment with the parish. She stated \$195.43 is the amount that's required by the State for the Parish bi-weekly.
19. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve \$195.43 bi-weekly for the Deputy Registrar position effective April 27, 2023." The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. Police Juror Jamie Ponville offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Michael Dias, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adoption of a resolution approving the holding of an election in Pierre Part/Belle River Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, on Saturday, October 14, 2023, to authorize the levy of a parcel fee therein." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
21. Police Juror Chris Carter offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adoption of a resolution to join the Attorney General of Louisiana in litigation against FEMA to challenge Risk Rating 2.0." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
22. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Ron Alcorn, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and authorize the President to sign the Declaration of Statistics for Assumption Parish related to National Flood Insurance Program." The motion was unanimously adopted. (declaration attached)
23. Police Juror Jamie Ponville offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake permit for Pierre Part/Belle River Knights of Columbus Council #5352 on 10/13-14, 2023." The motion was unanimously adopted.

24. Police Juror Michael Dias offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license submitted by Cortez Remodeling, LLC, Chatman Trucking and Maddex Blanchard Lawn Care." The motion was unanimously adopted.
25. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Police Juror Irving Comeaux, who requested that Lucien LeBlanc replace Al Ruiz on the Bayou L'Ourse Recreation District No. 1. He then requested that a letter of appreciation and thanks be sent to Mr. Ruiz for his years of service.
26. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Chris Carter, "THAT, the Police Jury approve replacing Al Ruiz with Lucien LeBlanc on the Bayou L'Ourse Recreation District No. 1 and send a letter of thanks to Mr. Ruiz for his years of service." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached).
27. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve re-appointing Mr. Greg Nolan as Board Member to the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
28. President Leroy Blanchard recognized Police Juror Ron Alcorn, who stated that the complaints regarding 225 Blackwell Lane, Belle Rose, LA started back in 2016. He stated that as the pictures indicate it is a nuisance to the community. He stated that the procedures in accordance with the ordinance have been followed. He then stated that he has been in conversation with the Secretary-Treasurer, the ADA and the Administrative Assistant regarding how to move forward with the cleanup and grass cutting. RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) “is updating the National Flood Insurance Program’s (NFIP) risk rating methodology through the implementation of a new pricing methodology,” titled “Risk Rating 2.0: Equity in Action”,

WHEREAS, FEMA states that Risk Rating 2.0’s “methodology leverages industry best practices and cutting-edge technology to enable FEMA to deliver rates that are actuarially sound, equitable, easier to understand and better reflect a property’s flood risk”,

WHEREAS, the Association of Levee Boards of Louisiana, members of both the Louisiana legislature and the federal legislature, members of state government, numerous Parish Presidents and their Councils, and many other entities in Louisiana and around the nation have grave concerns about the soundness of Risk Rating 2.0’s underlying methodology, its failure to properly take into account any of the numerous improvements Louisiana’s Levee Boards have made to the flood protection systems, and its catastrophic effect on Louisiana’s flood insurance rates and the ability of Louisiana’s homeowners to purchase flood insurance;

WHEREAS, many of those entities have repeatedly raised their concerns to FEMA, have asked FEMA for documentation showing FEMA’s underlying methodology, and have been passed from one federal office to the next without receiving any meaningful answers to their questions or documents showing FEMA’s underlying methodology;

WHEREAS, FEMA has denied and continues to deny the efforts of those who are trying to protect their interests, the interests of their members, the interests of many Louisiana industries, and the interests of Louisiana citizens, making what is supposed to be “Equity in Action” an inequitable program across the entire State of Louisiana;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Assumption Parish Police Jury joins the Attorney General of Louisiana in litigation against FEMA to challenge Risk Rating 2.0.

Declaration of Assumption Parish Police Jury

1. My name is Leroy Blanchard. I am over the age of 18 and am competent to make this declaration. The facts set forth in this declaration are based on my personal knowledge.
2. I am the president of the Assumption Parish and have served in that role since January 11th, 2023.
3. The Assumption Parish Police Jury is a local governmental subdivision of the State of Louisiana. La. Const. art. 6 § 44(1).
4. Assumption Parish is in Southeast Louisiana, measures 365 square miles, and has multiple major bodies of water within Assumption Parish, including Lake Verret, Bayou Lafourche, Belle River, and Bayou Boeuf.
5. Assumption Parish is prone to flooding because: (1) back water flooding from Atchafalaya River; (2) proximity to hurricane zone; (3) proximity to the coast (4) low elevation; (5) estimated 75% of Assumption Parish that is located in Special Flood Hazard Areas; (6) estimated 30% of businesses and houses in Assumption Parish are located in Special Flood Hazard Areas (7) Assumption Parish is a major flow through watershed supporting around 45% of the nation's drainage toward the Gulf of Mexico outfall
6. Since 2016, the Parish has been included in 16 Disaster and Emergency Declarations resulting in 5 major flooding events. Assumption Parish experiences an average of almost 1 flooding event per year.
7. Assumption Parish has authority to mitigate its flood risk and remediate flood damage. Specifically, Assumption Parish has authority to restrict or prohibit use that is dangerous to health, safety, or property in times of flood, or cause excessive increase in flood heights or velocities. The Parish can control the alteration of natural floodplains, stream channels and natural protective barriers, which are involved in the accommodation of floodwaters. Assumption Parish can control filling, grading, dredging and other development, which may increase flood damage. Assumption Parish can require facilities and property that are vulnerable to floods be protected against flood damage at the time of initial construction. Assumption Parish can regulate or prevent the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert floodwater or which may increase flood hazards to other lands. Assumption Parish has operated under a Policy Jury System since 1850. The Assumption Parish Police Jury is responsible for the formation of ordinances and for the general administration and operation of Assumption Parish.
8. To promote flood recovery within its borders, Assumption Parish has established Ch. 5, Sub-Ch. A of the Assumption Parish, Louisiana - Code of Ordinances. Assumption Parish has pursued grants, bonded GOMESA moneys, updated its Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2021, and developed and implemented a new Drainage & Flood Mitigation Master Plan effective April 2023.
9. The Parish spends approximately \$900,000 a year on flood mitigation projects. Examples are, discussed above along with other recent efforts such as updating 21 drainage/flood water pumps throughout the Parish in Special Flood Hazard Areas. A CDBG grant was used to dredge a major canal in Assumption Parish that will assist in flood mitigation.
10. Flood insurance is another important tool for protecting Assumption Parish residents and their most important financial assets—their home, business, and possessions. “Floods can happen anywhere,” and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) estimates that “just one inch of floodwater can cause up to \$25,000 in damage.”¹
11. Because most homeowners’ insurance does not cover flood damage, homeowners need a separate flood insurance policy to cover the building, the contents of the building, or both.
12. The federal National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is the flood insurer of last resort. FEMA manages the NFIP. A network of more than 50 private insurance companies and the NFIP Direct deliver NFIP to the public.²
13. “The NFIP provides flood insurance to property owners, renters, and businesses” alike.³ FEMA acknowledges that having flood insurance coverage helps policyholders recover faster when floodwaters recede.⁴ The NFIP requires homes and businesses in high-risk flood areas with mortgages from government-backed lenders to have flood insurance.

14. NFIP insurance is available to anyone living in one of the 23,000 participating NFIP communities.⁵ “A community is a governmental body with the statutory authority to enact and enforce development regulations.”⁶ A parish can be a community.
15. Assumption Parish is an NFIP community.
16. To become an NFIP community, Assumption Parish had to enact and implement floodplain management regulations aimed at mitigating the effects of flooding and has to enforce those regulations.⁷ Assumption Parish, Louisiana – Code of Ordinances Ch. 5, Sub-Ch. A.
17. Assumption Parish’s floodplain management regulations must satisfy state law as well as NFIP requirements.
18. As an NFIP community, Assumption Parish has committed: (a) to issue or deny permits to build or develop in the floodplain; (b) to inspect all development to assure it complies with the floodplain management regulations Assumption Parish was required to pass to become an NFIP community; (c) to maintain records of floodplain development; (d) to work with FEMA to prepare and revise floodplain maps; and (e) to help residents obtain information about flood hazards, flood insurance, and proper methods of construction.
19. FEMA reports that the quid pro quo arrangement between communities like Assumption Parish that participate in NFIP floodplain management, a pre-requisite for the Parish to be eligible to participate in the NFIP, has saved the nation over \$100 billion dollars in avoided floods over the last 40 years.
20. One tried-and-true method for reducing floods in Assumption Parish and across Louisiana is elevating homes and businesses, which FEMA used to consider when setting NFIP insurance rates.
21. Prior to Risk Rating 2.0, FEMA used the 1% Annual Exceedance Probability (AEP) flood as the basis for the National Flood Insurance Program. The 1% AEP flood is a flood that has a 1 in 100 chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year and an average recurrence interval of 100 years—often referred to as the “100-year flood.”
22. Before Risk Rating 2.0, FEMA used Flood Insurance Rate Maps to set rates and, in those maps, determined the AEP flood for each flood zone—called the Base Flood Elevation (BFE).
23. For each flood zone, FEMA advised elevating homes at least 1 foot above the BFE because FEMA expected its exposure to flood claims at or above that level to be very infrequent, and so FEMA lowered insurance rates accordingly. The higher a structure was elevated above the BFE level, the lower FEMA’s risk for having to pay claims and, therefore, the lower the insurance rate.
24. For decades, Assumption Parish and other parishes across Louisiana adopted FEMA’s Rate Maps and required buildings to be built to or above FEMA’s BFE. Assumption Parish, Louisiana – Code of Ordinances Ch. 5, Sub-Ch. A. Sec. 5-13(1)(2)
25. One reason Assumption Parish adopted FEMA’s Rate Maps and require buildings to be built to or above FEMA’s BFE was to take advantage of FEMA’s grandfathering policy for its own properties and to make that policy available to all who built in the Assumption Parish. FEMA’s grandfathering policy protected those who built in the Assumption Parish from huge rate increases if they built in accordance with the Rate Maps’ requirements.
26. In my estimation, approximately 100% of homeowners and 100% of business owners have relied on FEMA’s advice to elevate their homes and businesses in accordance with FEMA’s Rate Maps, FEMA’s grandfathering policy, and Assumption Parish, Louisiana – Code of Ordinances Ch. 5, Sub-Ch. A. Sec. 5-13(1)(2)
27. Despite Assumption Parish’s reliance on FEMA’s Rate Maps and grandfathering policy, under Risk Rating 2.0, elevating a structure above the BFE appears to have only a negligible effect on the insurance rate charged for elevated homes and businesses.
28. Moreover, Risk Rating 2.0 eliminated FEMA’s grandfathering policy. Although FEMA’s Community Rating System discounts are still in place for the Assumption Parish, residents of the Assumption Parish still wind up paying much higher rates because, unlike the grandfathering policy, the community rating system discounts do not stop the rates themselves from increasing. So even with the community rating system discounts, members of Assumption Parish pay higher rates under Risk Rating 2.0.
29. Despite the Parish’s projected reduction in flooding and flood damage risks impacted by Coastal Restoration projects such as Bayou Chene Gate Structure, and Atchafalaya River Dredging, Risk

Rating 2.0 has increased the cost of flood insurance for all properties in the Parish—both residential and commercial—that are in Special Flood Hazard Areas and are backed by federally insured mortgages.

30. Risk Rating 2.0 rate increases not only affect owners of property in Special Flood Hazard Areas but also those who rent properties in Special Flood Hazard Areas. The NFIP rate increases will likely be passed on to renters in the form of rent increases.
31. These rate increases harm all property owners, but they of course pose a particular hardship to low- and moderate-income property owners and their families, many of whom have lived in these areas for generations, and many of whom are racial minorities. Doubtless, many of these low- and moderate-income property owners and their families will struggle to pay for their mandatory insurance at its increased price. Indeed, these rate increases are likely to force many of these property owners and their families out of their homes in these areas, and perhaps out of our Parish altogether, thereby threatening the unique communities and cultures that have developed here over the course of generations.
32. As rates increase, many homeowners, business owners, and renters in Assumption Parish are likely to be priced out of their properties and forced to move to out of the Parish, which will decrease the Parish's tax base and therefore its financial ability to protect its residents and their property from flooding and flood damage.
33. And by creating a surplus of available property, this exodus from Assumption Parish will negatively impact the property values of those who remain, further decreasing the Parish's tax revenues.
34. Moreover, even if no one were to leave Assumption Parish, Risk Rating 2.0 is still likely to negatively affect property values in the Parish by increasing the cost of purchasing mandatory flood insurance that runs with the property, thereby decreasing the Parish's tax revenues.
35. This reduction in tax revenue will inhibit Assumption Parish's ability to protect its residents and their property. This would be tragic given the proven efficacy of Assumption Parish's flood mitigation efforts.
36. Risk Rating 2.0 apparently fails to account for all of Assumption Parish's flood reduction efforts. By failing to do so, Risk Rating 2.0 will likely decrease Assumption Parish's tax revenues and inhibit the Parish's ability to protect its residents and their property.
37. The only logical explanation for why Risk Rating 2.0 is increasing rates for Assumption Parish's levee-protected areas and elevated properties is that the methodology used in setting rates must be flawed.
38. But FEMA's refusal to reveal Risk Rating 2.0's methodology as required by federal law, despite numerous requests from all levels of state government, including parishes, and Louisiana's federal legislators, makes it impossible for Assumption Parish and its floodplain manager to determine where the flaws in FEMA's methodology lie.
39. That lack of transparency harms Assumption Parish's ability to work with FEMA, as required by the Parish's commitment as an NFIP community to work with FEMA to prepare and revise floodplain maps.
